August 3, 2025

18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." Luke 12:15

It can be difficult in today's society to not fall into the mindset that the more material things people have, the happier they will be. 22<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed you will because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteousness." Luke 14:13-14
