Fifth Sunday of Easter

"... whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do even greater ones than these ..." John 14:12

May 17, 2026

Seventh Sunday of Easter (Ascension of the Lord)

"... He raised his eyes to heaven and said ... 'I glorified you on earth by accomplishing the work you gave me to do.' "John 17: 1, 4

Jesus completed the work that God the Father set forth for him. What about us? Do we discern or know the work that God has planned for us? God has given each of us talents and abilities and as stewards of His kingdom, we are called to use those gifts to help others.

May 24, 2026

Pentecost

'There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit.' 1 Corinthians 4-7

God has given each of us unique gifts and talents. No one person's time, talent or treasure is exact to anyone else's, but whatever we have, we are called to share. That is stewardship.

May 31, 2026

The Most Holy Trinity

'The Lord, the Lord, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity.' Exodus 34:6

When we use our gifts from God to help others, we should do so because we are called to do so out of love and in thanksgiving to God. Stewardship is not using one's gifts because you fear an angry or vengeful God.
