

Keynote Information



Saturday's keynote, "How a Church on the Move Engages the World," will challenge us, in the words of Pope Francis, to go out to the world and encounter people "at the peripheries." The surest way for a church to die is to turn its focus inward on itself and its own needs. A Church "on the move" shifts its focus outward and seeks to bring the Good News of Jesus and the nearness of God to those who are experiencing brokenness, emptiness, despair and lack of direction in their lives.

Joe Paprocki, DMin, is National Consultant for Faith Formation at Loyola Press, where, in addition to his traveling/speaking responsibilities, he works on the development team for faith formation curriculum resources including *Finding God: Our Response to God's Gifts* and *God's Gift: Reconciliation and Eucharist*. Joe has more than 35 years of experience in ministry and has presented keynotes, presentations, and workshops in more than 100 dioceses in North America. Joe is a frequent presenter at national conferences including the Los Angeles Religious Education Congress, the Mid-Atlantic Congress, and the National Conference for Catechetical Leadership. He is the author of numerous books, including the best seller *The Catechist's Toolbox*, *A Church on the Move*, *Under the Influence of Jesus*, and many others.

THE BIBLICAL MUSEUM

The Bible Museum is Fr. José Cabrera's private collection of replicas of ancient Biblical manuscripts and artifacts. The museum shows the process of transmission of the Biblical text. You will be able to see replicas of Biblical manuscripts from 7th Century BC and the famous Dead Sea Scrolls. It also displays ancient New Testament papyri including the oldest NT fragment found to date and Codex Sinaiticus which is the oldest complete Christian Bible in the world. It also displays a replica of a page of the Gutenberg Bible and an original page of the first English Bible that came to America on the Mayflower: the Geneva Bible. There is even a Bible printed in Bay City in 1875 and a pocket Bible distributed to soldiers during WWII. You will be able to see a 1st Century original oil lamp and original coins in circulation during Jesus' time.

The Bible Museum gathers 4000 years of Biblical history in one room.
