



#### Calling of the Candidates

On behalf of the entire community, the candidates for ordination are called by name. They respond to the call, "Present."

#### Presentation of the Candidates

Testimony is given to their readiness and, in the name of the whole Church, request is made that the Bishop ordain them.

#### Election by the Bishop and Assent of the People

The Bishop, in the name of the Church, chooses them to be ordained. The consent of the People of God is required before a member of the Church can be ordained for service to the Church. As representatives of all God's people, we respond:

All: "Thanks be to God"

We express our approval with applause.

#### Promise of Obedience


The candidates kneel before the Bishop and promise obedience to the Ordinary.



## Nicene Creed
