
## Mass of Atonement Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross

# Most Reverend Robert D. Gruss, Principal Celebrant and Homilist

Monday, September 14, 2020 6:00 PM In his May 15, 2020 letter to the People of the Diocese of God in the Diocese of Saginaw, Bishop Gruss wrote:

The abuse of one child is a tragedy that cries out to heaven.

"See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon the face of my heavenly Father." (Matthew 10:18)

Victims, their families, and all of the Faithful are especially aggrieved by child sexual abuse by clergy. Each report of clergy assaults our memories and our Faith. While we cannot change the past, we can commit ourselves to preemptively identify the warning signs of abuse...

A **Mass of Atonement** is based on Scripture: *"If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it."* (1 Corinthians 12:26) Bishop Gruss unites himself with those who have suffered child abuse and neglect, in particular with those who have suffered child sexual abuse by clergy.






## Penitential Act

Bishop Gruss will remove or set aside the symbols of his office (his Episcopal ring, miter and crosier) and prostrate himself before the cross and altar. The prostration, similar to the prostration at the Good Friday Liturgy, signifies contrition, humility, reverence, and deep anguish for the suffering Christ, and the grief and sorrow of the Church.

The Catholic Bishop Abuse Reporting Service (CBAR) has been established to receive reports of sexual abuse and related misconduct by bishops and to relay those reports to proper Church authorities for investigation. To make a report, visit <u>ReportBishopAbuse.org</u> or phone (800) 276-1562. When a report includes a crime, such as the sexual abuse of a minor, it will also be reported to civil authorities. Otherwise, reports will be kept confidential.



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
