Sept. 7, 2025

23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

"... everyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple." Luke 14:33

Sept. 14, 2025

Sept. 21, 2025

25th Sunday of Ordinary Time

Sept. 28, 2025

26th Sunday of Ordinary Time

"... remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established..." ...Luke 16:25-26

There is a great division between those who have much and those who do not. We must help to bridge that separation by giving of ourselves and our gifts with those who have little or less. We can only do that during our life here on Earth.
